GRADE 1/2 - GREKUL

We have been super busy in our class learning letters and names with the grade 1s and focusing on mastering digraphs with the grade 2s. In our writing we've focused on writing complete sentences. We've written telling, asking, and exclamatory sentences. We've been working on learning our numbers to 20 and to 1000. We enjoyed a visit from the fire department and Constable Schulz, painting scarecrows and decorating pumpkins. We look forward to our break and lots more learning in November!



GRADE 1 - SENDECKI

The grade ones have had a busy month learning the names and sounds of the alphabet letters as well as some digraphs through our Jolly Phonics program. We are also learning to sound out words by chunking out the sounds we hear. In math, we have been working on patterns, calendar skills, counting to 20 and writing our numbers to 20. We enjoyed learning about fire safety and meeting some of the firemen that work in our community. We are looking forward to Halloween and our upcoming November break! Please make sure you practice the word lists and review our Jolly Phonics sounds daily.

CLASS HIGHLIGHTS

GRADE 2 - GOODRICH

It has been a great start to the year. We have been working on mapping and learning about community in Social Studies and expanding our knowledge of Matter in Science. In Language, we have been focusing on mastering digraphs and grammar. In our writing, we've focused on writing complete sentences and adding more details. In Math, we have been working on Place Value and showing numbers in a variety of different ways. We have been working on how to be a good friend and showing respect.

GRADE 5 - SNOWDEN

In grade five, we are working to establish a writing community in the classroom. We are thrilled to announce our Global Read Aloud event! This year, we will be reading "And Then Boom" by Lisa Fipps. We will receive postcards from other schools participating in the Global Read Aloud, fostering friendships and sharing perspectives.

Grade fives continue to develop number sense using whole numbers to ten million and flexibility with numbers. Students are encouraged to explore ideas and ask questions to foster mathematical curiosity. Multiplication facts are another essential part of fifth grade. Knowing your times tables and recalling them quickly will help students in many areas of math and beyond.

Fifth grade has also been learning about weather and how fascinating it is and something we experience every day. But how do we measure it? That's where instruments come in, with simple materials, grade fives have been building instruments and have had fun learning how they work.



CLASS HIGHLIGHTS



GR 7 & 8 ELA:

7s and 8s have been engaging with an identity theme for our first unit in ELA.

This has involved experience with various texts, including short stories, poems, songs, as well as short and full-length films. Students have engaged in mini-lessons on annotation skills, plot and literary elements. We have responded in a variety of ways, including socratic seminar, whole-class and small group discussion, as well as a variety of written responses and graphic designs.

Most recently, students have engaged in a "Soundtrack of my Life," comprehensive assignment as a unit summary assessment. This involved curating five songs to connect to significant events in their lives or qualities they possess, explaining the significance of their choices, and designing a unique album cover for their soundtrack.

They will soon engage in their first project-based learning task. Stay tuned for more updates regarding this! Our next units will diverge and change focus to full-length novel studies.


